Your Cub Scout will need your help every year to complete the Youth Protection training found at the beginning of each Handbook.

Research shows that children whose parents talk to them about preventing abuse are better able to protect themselves. Working through the cub scout training together is a good way to have a continuing dialogue about personal safety. Open communication gives children the reassurance that no matter how frightening something may be, their parents are there to help.

Youth Protection Training will also give you an overview of the BSA policies and practices that are put in place to protect the cub scouts.



Welcome to Cub Scouts!

With your help, your Cub Scout will quickly earn his Bobcat. Find the requirements in your Wolf handbook.



After completing 7 adventures he'll earn his Wolf! He'll receive a belt loop for each completed adventure. Once he turns 9 he can join Bears.



Seven new adventures (and belt loops) later he'll earn his Bear. Once he's 10 he can join Webelos.



Webelos and Arrow of Light adventures are combined into one fun, busy year! He'll earn pins to reward his progress toward finishing all 11 adventures.



The Wolf, Bear, and Webelos dens meet during the week for activities and outings. About once a month, we combine dens to celebrate the requirements our cubs have been completing. We award belt loops, pins, and patches. Sometimes pack meetings have an activity and a snack too!

Families are invited to Pack meeting. During den meetings it's usually just the boys and their den leaders.

To start with, your Cub Scout will need a blue Cub shirt (\$24.99). You probably want to get one a little big so he can wear it from ages 8-11. It's nice but not necessary to buy a handbook (\$12.95). The information is also all available online. Getting a belt is useful for belt loop awards (\$9.99).

The first patches you will need to attach to your Cub shirt include the council shoulder patch, your pack number, and the Bobcat patch. The back inside cover of your handbook has instructions for where to attach all the patches.



RELIGIOUS KNOT PATCH

The religious knot patch is one way the Cub Scout program overlaps with the Faith in God program from church. In your Faith in God booklet you will see seven requirements that are also marked with a square knot (see below).

By completing all seven of these requirements, you earn your religious knot! It's one of the few patches you can wear on your Cub Scout uniform and also on your Scouting uniform when you're older.

We hope you will also make time to work on the rest of the Faith in God program. The goals and activities provide an opportunity to spiritually prepare for the responsibilities that are part of being a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

You can finish this program between the ages of 8 and 12. The final five activities of the booklet are entitled: Preparing for the Priesthood. This section is designed to be completed when you are about 11.
